QUEENSLAND THEATRE



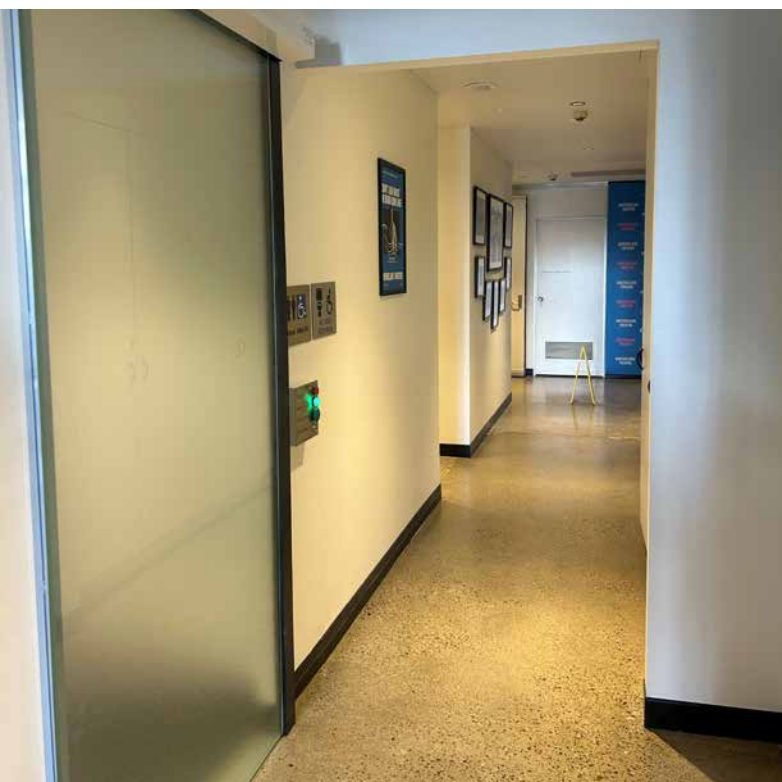
This is the Queensland Theatre building.

Sometimes during the show there may be loud noises or bright lights. I can put on my headphones or sunglasses, or cover my eyes and ears.





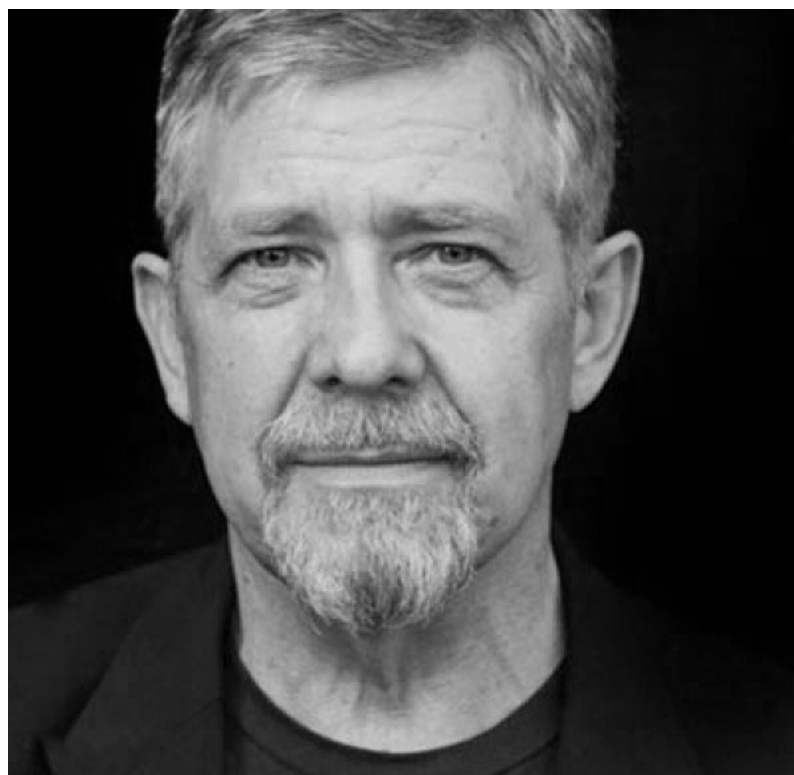
This is Dan Daw
