Director's Note

The Norman Mailer Anecdote is a metaphor for what we hide behind.

This is *not* message theatre. Like plays should, it argues all sides passionately. It entertains, pokes, and challenges who we are today and what we hope to be tomorrow. These are the elements that drew me to Anthony's play when I heard it read as runner up in the Queensland Premier's Drama Award. It struck me as a smart, robust, and entertaining discussion of themes that are quite frankly not that fun to talk about. The nuance of consent, danger of social media and the consequences of an alcohol fuelled culture are weaved into a ripper of a story driven by questions surrounding personal and collective accountability.

No one wakes up thinking they are a bad person. Here we have three over-achievers in crisis — guilty of grave mistakes — fighting to not be tarred by them for life and in legacy. Each blame, gaslight, cover and forget — anything that avoids throwing their hands up in the air and taking responsibility for their actions. In a black and white world, where heroes and villains are defined quickly and often without all the facts, can we reasonably expect much more from each other? Furthermore, words equate with fists in the 'safe space' era. As a result, people operate from anxiety to care about all things all at once while perpetuating impossible images of virtuousness.

But don't let me tell you what to think. Pour a wine, buckle up and make up your own mind. This is provocative stuff that I hope stays with you well beyond the blackout.
