With a commitment to supporting the professional development of aspiring theatre practitioners, Queensland Theatre, based in Brisbane, is offering a training program for two early-career arts/theatre workers or workers with skills in the range of disciplines or roles outlined above, who want to develop their skills in the performing arts and the delivery of live performance.

The program includes two paid placements on either a full-time or a part-time (a minimum of 20 hours per week) basis over six months to gain on-the-job knowledge and experience in the planning, making and running of live theatre productions.

Led and supported by the Queensland Theatre team, and working along-side a diverse range of theatre industry professionals, participants in the program will build their production technical skills, creative skills and/or stagecraft through practical hands-on training, collaboration and creative problem-solving experiences.

If you are passionate about developing your skills in the performing arts, this training opportunity will open up creative pathways and possibilities.
